Theme 6 Project Guide:

Deadline: August 8, 2022

Purpose: Working in groups and collaborating on projects is an essential skill to practice. The group project allows you to demonstrate your understanding of Theme 6 of the integrative themes, as well as apply the information learned in the psychology of groups. Theme 6 states, "Applying psychological principles can change our lives, organizations, and communities in positive ways." Groups will be assigned the second week of class based on topic interests. The essential part of this assignment is developing a community action plan that tackles an issue you are passionate about that arises in your community. You will demonstrate your knowledge of psychological principles by applying what you've learned in the class to this community action plan.

Components of Final Proposal

Explanation of social issue selected (5 points)

- Must be 1 page
- Explains what the social issue is and why you selected this particular social issue
- Explains the root causes of the social issue
- You must cite 1-2 reliable sources.

Strategy and project proposal (10 points)

- Must be 2-3 pages
- Addresses who will be impacted and where the project will occur
- Describes your "ultimate outcome" and the nature of what you want to see improved through this project
- Explains in detail what the project entails

Note: Nothing actually has to be done for this project, but you should explain it thoroughly enough that if you present this proposal to someone, they will know generally the steps that need to be taken to accomplish the task

Connection to psychology (10 points)

- Must be 1 page
- Names and defines particular psychological concept learned in course
- Explains how this psychological component connects to the project
- You must cite 1 source with concept and definition.

Format and Grammar (5 points)

- Times New Roman, 12-point font, double spaced, 1-inch margins
- Free of grammar and spelling mistakes
- You must cite sources in APA style.

Components of Final Presentation (20 points)

Summarizes each of the three sections from proposal

- Explains your process of completing the projectAnswers any questions
